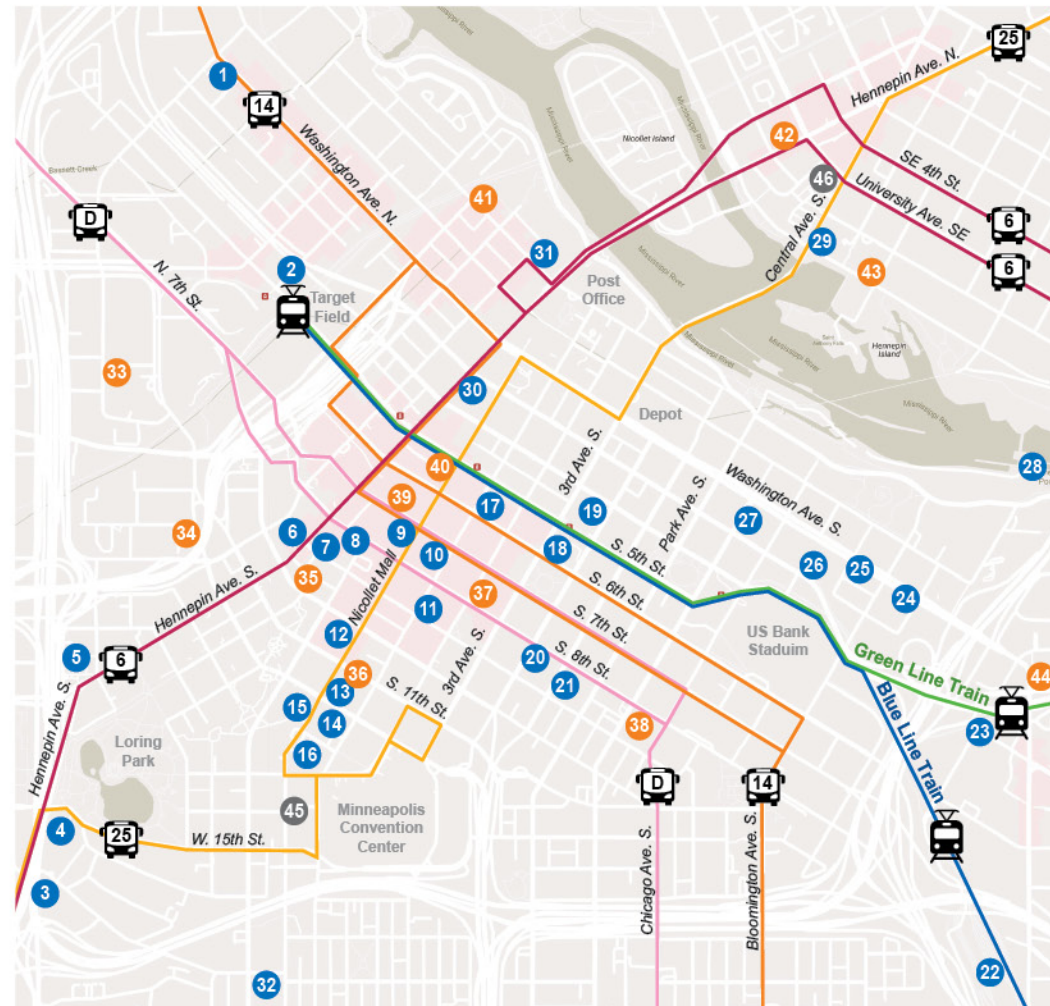

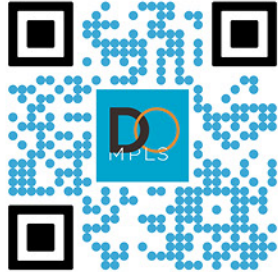


### ZaRah Integrated Root Center

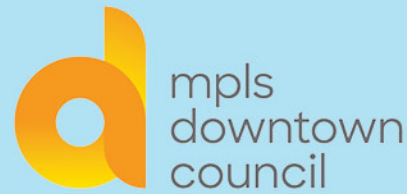
